Journey Farthest Out is an authentic expression of the Camps Farthest Out movement founded by Dr. Glenn Clark. A college professor, coach, author, and firm believer in the power of prayer, Glenn had a vision to create a spiritual training ground where we could come together as "athletes of the spirit" to renew mind, body and soul, steep ourselves in prayer, and go farther out in our individual relationships with God. Prayer is at the heart of the JFO experience: silent prayer, spoken prayer, individual prayer and group prayer. As we explore our spirituality, we respect one another's privacy while encouraging sharing and a oneness of spirit.

Celebrating the full diversity of God's creation, we invite all to come experience the joy of kingdom living through participation in the full camp program. GPC's facilities are located on 184 acres of forested grounds that sit at the edge of nearly one mile of Lake Winnepesaukee shoreline, offering a beautiful and rustic setting for our Winni JFO family camp.

- Charges are payable by check to JFO Winni or online at [winnijfo.org](http://winnijfo.org)
- Registration fee for adults (age 21+) \$115.
- Full registration and at least half room and board payment due by **March 15, 2026**.
- Full payment is due to the registrars by **May 15, 2026**.
- Day visitors must give advance notice before arrival. We charge a \$20 per day registration fee.
- Payment to GPC for day use and meals must be made directly at the GPC office.
- There is no charge for children under age 3. Guests must bring their own crib.
- We are unable to reduce rates or give refunds if you arrive later or depart earlier than your registration indicates.
